Clara Best from New Zealand Class, recommends 'Nevermoor—The Trials of Morrigan Crow' (written by Jessica Townsend)


"I have loved reading this book because I really enjoy mysteries. The characters are really interesting too so you can never get bored with this story! There are other books in the series and I can't wait to read those next."
